I. SIGNIFICANT TRENDS:

The most significant trends in the college have been the change in name of the program and department from Health and Human Performance to Kinesiology which better represents the areas of study in the department. Kinesiology means the study of human movement and health, and this better describes the mission and programs within the department. The National Research Council (NRC) has recently recognized kinesiology as an academic discipline. Consequently, most programs in major research universities are changing or have changed their name to Kinesiology.

The Department of Food Science and Human Nutrition has implemented curricular changes to address societal needs related to food science and nutrition. The major changes are 1) experiential learning opportunities in culinary science and nutrition research through a new major in Culinary Science, and 2) an increased number of distance courses.

There were 61 courses dropped and 69 courses added. Most of the new courses added in dietetics are courses offered online via the Great Plains Interactive Distance Education Alliance (GP-IDEA, a collaboration between 11 universities) as part of a graduate certificate in Food Safety and Defense and a Masters of Family and Consumer Sciences with specialization in dietetics. The instructors for these courses will come from all eleven institutions in GP-IDEA but the students need to be registered at their home university, therefore the courses were added. Most of the new courses in Kinesiology at the 400-500 level are to facilitate graduate students obtaining teaching credentials in physical education to teach in the public schools.
