The Senate was honored to have the new President of the Board of Regents (BOR) speak to current issues. Especially notable was Mr. Miles longstanding contributions to higher education (Drake University and others) and to the business sector in Iowa and regionally and nationally. Mr. Miles was also pleased to take questions from the Senate floor.

IV. Special Order: Library Update - 3:55 p.m. - Olivia Madison, Dean, Parks Library

Dean Madison provided an update on pressures experienced by libraries nationally in higher education and Iowa State in particular, especially with respect to new acquisitions and electronic (bundled) journal purchases, which have increased annually to a marked degree. Existing resources have not stemmed the decrease in progress of the library in comparison to other Iowa, and regional and peer, institutions.

Faculty Senators and guests provided a moment of silence in respect and to honor the passing of esteemed colleges. We honored: Irvin C. Anderson, David Leonard Lendt, Samuel H. Liu, and G. Portraits of each member of the faculty were displayed as part of the memorial and key facts about achievements and contributions were read aloud for all to appreciate the importance of the losses resulting from their passing.

Update on promotion and tenure and non-tenure eligible faculty, and thoughts on why we are losing faculty—Executive Vice President and Provost Elizabeth Hoffman

Provost Hoffman provided the annual report on results of the promotion and tenure process. She spoke to decision making that agreed to permit, as appropriate, faculty seeking tenure as well as promotion to delay a final decision for one year after the submission process reached the level of the Provosts Office. Her remarks followed closely on discussion, and her pledge to analyze and develop strategies, relevant to hiring high-quality faculty members who would also be retained, at least through the tenure process. Spousal accommodation, salary and start-up funds, location, and the institutional policy climate all played a role in both acceptances and non acceptances of offers, including retention situations. The Provost also spoke to strategies emerging which targeted particular disciplines or areas of special interest on an annual basis, and which involved deans and chairs, for both hiring and retention.
